This week we are joining with the Oklahoma Wesley Covenant Association in prayer. The following is their Prayer Guide for October 16-22. We encourage you to join to-

gether with them this week in prayer and fasting.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. Isaiah 43:2

"I will be with you." These are comforting and encouraging words for us to hear as we journey closer to the Special called Annual Conference for the Oklahoma



Conference of the United Methodist Church. I don't know about you, but it certainly feels like we are in the middle of a raging river and cannot pass over. The undercurrent seems very strong. It is easy for me to look at the raging river around me and not look to Christ Jesus, who has walked with me through every trial in my life. This one is no different. I believe God has His hand upon us, and God is working it out in ways unknown to you and me. It is the way of faith.

In the grand scheme of the Methodist/Wesleyan movement, there have been times when those who seek to experience the leading of the Holy Spirit have faced a "raging river." The situation in our denomination seems difficult to understand, much less manage. I am encouraged, however, by the Scripture and the history of the Wesleyan movement. Time and time again, we are reminded that God will be with us. All of us. It is vital that we hold fast to the Biblical standard of how we are to treat one another. This will be very important in the weeks and months ahead. As we look toward this Special Session of the Annual Conference, we ask that you be in prayer.

On Wednesday, October 19, we ask you to fast and pray. Would you consider fasting a meal if you cannot fast the entire day? Wesley practiced fasting every Wednesday and Friday from dawn to 3 pm. The purpose of our fast is to be open to the Spirit, and I believe this will help us in conversation and during the business sessions.

Below is a guide for your daily prayer time leading to the Special Called Annual Conference.

**Sunday, October 16**: Thank God for his faithfulness. The God of love and mercy is still the GOD of justice and holiness. Pray that we may not be faithless and that we may encounter Jesus in life-altering ways. (2 Timothy 2:11-13)



**Monday, October 17:** Pray for Bishop Nunn. Pray that he may continue to be led by the Holy Spirit. (1 Timothy 2: 1-4)

**Tuesday, October 18:** Pray for the pastors and laity that will be attending the Special called Annual Conference. Pray that God's presence will be with them as they meet and seek God's will for all of the churches of the Oklahoma Annual Conference. (Psalm 25:4-5)

**Wednesday: October 19: Fast with us today.** Pray for the Special called Annual Conference. Pray that the Holy Spirit will be present and that all who come will work together, seek healing, and bless those congregations choosing to leave the denomination. Pray that the work of the Kingdom of God will be done in and through the sessions.

**Thursday, October 20:** Pray for all conference leadership. Pray that all will seek God and that the work of the Kingdom of God will prevail. (Matthew 6:33)

**Friday, October 21:** Pray that we will be faithful witnesses for the Kingdom of God. Jesus prayed that we would point others to Christ. John 17: 15-19






