
Christian Symbol

We're excited to walk through this season with your families as we help our children understand the true wonder of Christmas: the long-awaited arrival of our Savior.


Cards of Thanks for Our Heroes

Christmas Mission Offering

Our Mission Committee has decided that our Christmas Eve offering will be going to support our mission partners in Kigoma, Tanzania. In 2021 we came alongside our long-time mission partners in Morogoro, Tanzania to expand their mission to the city of Kigoma, in western Tanzania. Through your generosity, we were able to raise enough money to build St. Mark's in Kigoma which is now a thriving congregation in a beautiful building. In 2023 we raised an even larger amount of money to build a regional women's center. That building is largely completed and we will be sending a delegation to celebrate its dedication on June 7 of this year. But both the Women's Center and the church were not able to complete a full equipping of their interiors with the dollars provided. Our goal with this offering will be to bring both projects to full completion. We will be sharing more details as we get closer to Christmas, but we ask now that you be in prayer for how you might be able to participate.

Kelly Jo is organizing a festive night of Christmas caroling. All are welcome! Contact Kelly Jo to participate.



A New Advent Story for Our Kids!

This year we're using a special Advent book for our kids called The Biggest Story: Advent --and it's not your usual Christmas story! Instead of starting with shepherds, angels, and wise men, this book takes us on an adventure *before* the manger. It shares the "story before the story"--the promises God made all through the Old Testament about the Savior who would one day come.

Each day of Advent, kids will hear a short, cozy, bedtime-style chapter that feels like a storybook...but every page points to God's big rescue plan and His amazing love for us. Some of the promises in the book are ones they might already know, and some might be brand-new--but all of them help us see how God was preparing the world for Jesus long before that first Christmas night.

Our hope is that this little Advent journey will help kids (and parents and grandparents!) see just how big and wonderful God's story really is.

Youth Winter Retreat 2026 - Sign Up Now!




