We will be having a special outdoor Christmas Eve service this year. Services will be held in front of the church with the staging area under the







God Came Near, Max Lucado, 6 sessions with 28 minute videos. In the midst of the gloom of

A fever of 100.4 or higher in the past 14 days.


Prolonged exposure to someone who has tested positive for COVID-
