

Capital Campaign Update from Pastor Randy

These are exciting times! We are moving ahead with construction beginning as early as January 1, 2026. Before construction begins, many things will need to take place.

First, we have to make some solid plans regarding the logistics of how St Mark's is going to function with a good portion of our facility being unusable for a time. This is where we are going to need everyone's understanding and goodwill - Classes may be displaced from their regular rooms. Some things may end up being stored in places that aren't as convenient - you get the idea. We will do our best to be sensitive to everyone's needs and wants, but everyone will need to sacrifice for the greater good.

Second, we will have some demolition and moving days coming soon. In order to keep costs down, we are doing the moving and much of the demolition ourselves. So we are going to need lots of help. Please keep an eye out for the days as they are announced and then be ready to put in the time and effort needed.

Third, to be totally up front, we still need some more money. We are close to having received enough to cover the cost of the project - Close enough that we feel comfortable moving ahead, but we are not completely there yet. We are moving forward under the assumption that contributions will continue to come in and by the time the bills need paid we will have all that we need to cover them. But that

assumption rests on trusting all of us to continue contributing to the campaign fund. So, please, keep your building contributions coming.

But, not to "bury the lead" with details, we are now very close to actual construction beginning. Your faithfulness in prayer and giving is making a transformation of our facility possible. Thank you, for your generosity. Thank you for the patience I know you will show during construction. And get ready - God is doing an exciting new thing at St Mark's.

St. Mark's Bethany SAFE CHURCH Policy

At St. Mark's Bethany, we prioritize the safety and well-being of our children and youth. In accordance with our commitment to maintaining a secure environment, we have established the following access policy for the children's programming areas:



Authorized Access:

Only children, parents, or approved caregivers are permitted to enter or traverse through the designated children's areas during the following hours:

- **Sunday:** 9:00 AM 12:15 PM
- **Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday:** 8:30 AM 2:30 PM
- **Wednesday:** 6:00 PM 8:00 PM

Restricted Access:

For the safety of our children, we kindly ask that all other individuals refrain from entering or passing through these areas during the specified hours, except in cases of emergency or to access emergency exits.

This policy aligns with St. Mark's Procedure for the Implementation of the Safety Policy for Children, Youth, and Vulnerable Adults (Refer to Paragraph 2.c.).
