


STRIVE Annual Fundraiser for St. Mark's Student Ministries

This year marks the 26th anniversary of STRIVE at St. Mark's!

Here's how it works:

- Students will ask the St. Mark's family and friends and members of their families and the community for donations to support St. Mark's fall 2025-26-student camps, retreats, missions and the Jesus University Scholarship fund.
- At the end of the fundraiser, students will participate in an 8-hour workday as a way of saying "Thank You" to the church and the community!

- Donations may be either a flat amount or based on the number of hours a student works during the workday.

- PLEDGE DEADLINE: NOVEMBER 2, 2025



Since 1991, Joy and John Imel have called St. Mark's home. Their journey here began after a difficult church split at Putnam City Methodist. They were looking for a church closer to home—and one day, after their son went on a ski trip with a St. Mark's youth, they decided to visit. It didn't take long before they felt right at home. "We liked it," John said simply. "The preacher was good, and the people were friendly."

The Imels quickly became active members. John joined the choir, continuing a love of music he carried from his previous church, and together they found a welcoming Sunday School class. Over the years, they've built countless friendships and many happy memories—from children's events like the Bible Walk to large Christmas performances with choirs and actors. They still recall the day church members worked together to clear the lot next door, turning a mess into something beautiful through teamwork and dedication.



Their spirit of service shines through their long involvement at The ROC, where they've volunteered for more than a decade—Joy for about 15 years and John for nearly as long. "We feel like we're doing some good to help people who really need it," John shared. Joy added, "It's almost like a family group now. The volunteers work really well together."

Faith has been woven through every part of their lives. Both grew up in church and raised their family in the same spirit. They've faced testing times but found deeper trust in God through those experiences. With three children, ten grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren, they cherish the blessings of family—and are especially thankful that one daughter and her husband, a pastor, recently moved back to Oklahoma after many years in Missouri.

John and Joy have also been part of several mission trips—to Alaska, Arizona, Honduras, Puerto Rico, and even Russia—and have traveled widely, including Australia, New Zealand, and Scandinavia. They share a love for sports, golf, and laughter. In fact, their playful idea of buying their husbands golf passports led to something much bigger—the creation of Second Winders, a fellowship group for adults at St. Mark's. "We thought others might like to go too," Joy said, smiling. "So we planned a trip, called a meeting, and that's how Second Winders got started!"

When asked what St. Mark's means to them, their answer was simple but heartfelt. "It means an awful lot to us," John said. "All the friends we've made and the encouragement we've received from everyone." Joy added, "This has always been a place where we could help and a place we knew we could come if we needed help."

Thank you, Joy and John Imel, for sharing your story with us and for being part of our St. Mark's family.



If you can help with meal prep, please sign up on the counter in the narthex! Thank you for supporting and encouraging our local students.




The Heartland Conference **Women's Retreat** November 14 & 15, 2025




