


# STRIVE Annual Fundraiser for St. Mark's Student Ministries

Childcare will be available for little ones (five and under). To help us prepare, please sign up through Church Center so we will know how many children to prepare for.


## **Chrismons - Symbols of Our Faith**

#### The Heartland Conference Women's Retreat November 14 & 15, 2025



# Capital Campaign Update from Pastor Randy

The first project of our "Taking Root" campaign has been accomplished. We now have a new roof over the offices and a good portion of the classrooms. This, coupled with the new roof we put on the Family Life Center a couple of years ago, means that a large part of our facility is now covered with roofing that should last for decades. This is a great step forward as it makes little sense to fix the inside unless the structure itself is secure.

We are now moving on to the next, and largest, project of the campaign. We have approved the plans and procedures for the updates to the Family Life Center, Barnett Hall, Lobby and all bathrooms. Jay Sears, who is serving as the construction manager for this part of the project (thank you Jay!), will be giving a thorough update on the project in the Sanctuary after second service. I hope you make it a priority to stay for the presentation. In my opinion, the plans look even better than I had dreamed and I think you will be excited to see what lies in store for the church.

Financially, we are doing well. To date we have received \$838,565 of our \$1.35 million pledged. Normally,

a church can expect to receive the fulfillment of the 3-year pledges at 50%, 30%, 20% across three years. We are already well over 50% and we are only 6 months into our first year! This is very important for us. Since we are committed to not going into debt, we can only move forward as the money is available to do so. So, receiving this much this early is allowing us to move forward more quickly.

### \*\*St. Mark's Bethany SAFE CHURCH Policy\*\*

At St. Mark's Bethany, we prioritize the safety and well-being of our children and youth. In accordance with our commitment to maintaining a secure environment, we have established the following access policy for the children's programming areas:



#### \*\*Authorized Access:\*\*

Only children, parents, or approved caregivers are permitted to enter or traverse through the designated children's areas during the following hours:

- \*\*Sunday:\*\* 9:00 AM 12:15 PM
- \*\*Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday: \*\* 8:30 AM 2:30 PM
- \*\*Wednesday:\*\* 6:00 PM 8:00 PM

#### \*\*Restricted Access:\*\*

For the safety of our children, we kindly ask that all other individuals refrain from entering or passing through these areas during the specified hours, except in cases of emergency or to access emergency exits.

This policy aligns with St. Mark's Procedure for the Implementation of the Safety Policy for Children, Youth, and Vulnerable Adults (Refer to Paragraph 2.c.).
