

Life Groups include four personal growth elements gathered around the cross

1) Mission & Ministry

Plan a mission or ministry to accomplish within an agreed timeframe – both personal and group plans are shared.

Your *Life Group* may be a Mission team.

2) Prayer/Relationship

Share prayer needs related to conquering sin and experiencing spiritual transformation.

Experiment with types and ways of praying that are described in Scripture.

3) Study Scripture

This should usually be a study of Scripture.

4) Accountability

Encourage each other to keep striving toward growth goals previously set by the group and individuals.

Hey Youth Families!

Here is the J.U. information for this coming school year!

Jesus University is a scholarship program that is funded by our annual STRIVE fundraiser.

Scholarships earned through J.U. can be used for continuing education after high school. It can now also be used during high school for strictly educational programs. For instance, if a student would like tutoring, they will be able to use J.U. scholarship money for this. However, scholarship money cannot be used for extracurricular.

Money is earned based on several areas of involvement.

- 40% Sunday School Attendance
- 25% Wednesday Night Attendance
- 25% STRIVE fundraiser and Workday (this is mandatory. The fundraiser begins Oct. 2 and ends with the workday on Nov. 2)
- 10% Camps/Retreats/Missions

The hope is that each student enrolled in J.U. will have the opportunity to receive a maximum of \$200. However, this depends on how much is raised in the STRIVE fundraiser and how many camp/mission/retreat scholarships are needed by all students over the course of the year.

Because the Sunday morning attendance is so important to J.U. earnings, I will have a set time to take attendance on Sundays. Sunday School begins at 9:45. Attendance will be taken at 9:55. Anyone who arrives after 9:55 will receive half credit for that day.

To enroll in J.U. for this coming school year, let me know and turn in your enrollment fee by August 25th!

- There is a \$15/person enrollment fee.
- It is \$10/person if you are signing up 3 or more students.

We are so blessed to be a part of a church family that is so supportive of our students. Jesus University is an unusual, amazing opportunity for students and I hope everyone is able to enroll!


