

### Christian Symbol

POINSETTIA — This

shrub, native to Mexico, is at the heart of legend about a poor girl who wanted to bring Baby Jesus a gift one Christmas Eve. As she walked to church, she gathered a bouquet of weeds — which Jesus miraculously transformed into lovely red flowers. Thus the poinsettia (named for Joel Poinsett, the U.S. ambassador to Mexico who first brought the plant to America) is known in Mexico as la flor de la Nochebuena (flower of the Holy Night). The poinsettia is also an ideal Christmas symbol because its leaves turn red when deprived of sunlight and its flowers (the red inner buds) bloom in December.

We're excited to walk through this season with your families as we help our children understand the true wonder of Christmas: the long-awaited arrival of our Savior.


## **Cards of Thanks for Our Heroes**



## Youth Winter Retreat 2026 - Sign Up Now!





# Capital Campaign Update from Pastor Randy

Everything continues to be on schedule for work to begin on Phase 1 of our construction in the Middle of January. Phase 1 includes a total remodel of the Family Life Center (gym) and Barnett Hall, plus the addition of a family bathroom where the custodian closet is currently located. One of the things we will be doing to keep costs down is to do some of the demolition ourselves. We do not yet have a schedule of work days, but look for them to begin sometime after December 21. Work has already begun to relocate many of the things currently stored in the rooms where the work will begin and we appreciate everyone who is working to get us ready for demolition and construction.

Another thing to celebrate is the generous giving from the people of St Mark's. In my last end of month update in October, we had received \$858,092 - an amount that put us ahead of expectations and in position to begin Phase 1. In the last month, our total amount given has climbed all the way to \$967,025. It's truly amazing. When we celebrated Commitment Sunday on February 23, I don't think any of us believed we would be on track to receive more than \$1,000,000 before the end of the year. But that is exactly where we are. All glory to God and many thanks to everyone for your generous contributions.
