
Wednesday Night Fall Programming Gearing up



St. Mark's Mission Statement

To build a family of believers who glorify God and help each other become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ

I am writing this letter for the purpose of addressing a very important "next step" in the church's disaffiliation process.

We have overwhelmingly agreed that disaffiliation is the right thing for St. Mark's. This decision has set us on a path that is well defined by the Oklahoma Conference. In October the conference will vote to ratify the decision we as a church have made. Ten days prior to that ratification vote St. Mark's must deposit the required funds in an escrow account. The amount that we must be prepared to pay is \$467,000.

As the finance committee chair it is my task to recommend the best way for St. Mark's to come up with the money. Thankfully we are a church that has no debt, a significant asset in our property and a faithful congregation that gives generously. With that being the case there is every confidence that we can have the money ready when the conference requires it in the first week of October.

Now comes the ask. There are different ways to secure the funds needed. But our goal, and our prayer, is not to heap debt on the church. Ideally, this vote to uphold our conservative/traditional views and ensure that St. Mark's future is secure within a denomination that will respect and support us, ideally, it has motivated us to do whatever we can, each of us individually, to get it done. So, we are embarking on a fund-raising campaign throughout the month of September to raise as much money as we can.

God is faithful. He has proven His faithfulness to St. Mark's and to me personally in so many ways. I have no doubt that He will provide exactly what we, the church, and what we individually need. Please pray about what God would have you do for this campaign.

This specific gift needs to be above and beyond regular giving. We need as many people as possible to make a one-time gift in the month of September. Donations need to be marked as "Disaffiliation Fund" donations.

It is the prayer of the finance chair and the finance committee that we would raise enough money in September that a loan is not needed. But if a loan is needed it would be our goal to pay off the loan as soon as possible. Along with the one-time donation please also consider committing to an additional monthly gift to be used for the purpose of paying off a loan. Any Amount will be helpful whether it be \$10 per month or \$100 per month. Receiving the commitment cards will help your finance committee set the terms of the loan if a loan is needed.

Thank you for reading this letter and prayerfully considering how you can help. May God clearly guide you as you seek His guidance, and may this effort be met with peace and comfort as we seek God's glory as a church.

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ whose Love, understanding and scriptures support us in all that we do. I pray that the Holy Spirit is now and with you always.

St. Mark's is going through exciting times in the history of its ministry and mission. Opportunities are abundant at St. Mark's and we have many opportunities to demonstrate our long standing history of seeking after God's will through Methodism.

To seek to stay a Bible believing and Holy Spirit filled Church we recently voted to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. This means that after the next annual conference we will no longer be part of the United Methodist Church, but it also means that our calling as God's Church continues to be as clear as the day we were founded over 50 years ago.

As we continue to look at our ministries and missions we look forward to the next steps. After contemplation, discussion and prayer our church council has voted to recommend we affiliate with the Global Methodist Church. The Global Methodist Church has been founded to support churches that have Methodist values and connectionalism in their spirit in a bottom up fashion. Churches that are seeking to be open to the Holy Spirit and willing to study and uphold His Scriptures will be able to remain themselves while being part of a National and Global commitment to missions and ministries.

The Global Methodist Church is not asking for a commitment through contract or trust, but is seeking to provide a way for churches, like St. Mark's, to be connectional while remaining autonomous in owning our facilities, supporting our pastors and our congregation. The GMC is seeking to provide support and continuing education for pastors while not forcing a relationship between Churches and pastors. The goal is to listen to churches and help in providing options instead of commands. Our pastor will have opportunities for retirement support, educational support and the coordination of connecting with other pastors, but will also be afforded the opportunity be the pastor of St. Mark's as long as both are happy with the pairing.

The main commitment that GMC is asking is for us to decide as a church, if we want to be an active part in being a member and building this new denomination. On September 18, 2022 between services we will meet together as a church to have a vote on whether we should join the Global Methodist Church. All St. Mark's members will have a say in what we are going to do. I encourage you to do your own research into the GMC and see the opportunities of being at the start of a great organization.
