A Message from Pastor Randy concerning Current conditions

As everyone already knows, we are in the midst of another COVID surge. The bad news is that this variant is the most contagious one we've encountered, and new cases have been reaching new highs every day. The good news is that it appears to cause less severe symptoms in most people. There is no "right way" to proceed at this point. Rational and well-intentioned people can and do look at the same data and come to different decisions about the best way to go about living through the surge. We believe you know your own health situation and we respect the way you choose to proceed. With that said, the church has made the following decisions:

- 1. Sunday morning worship will continue as normal. We believe in-person worship is essential to overall well-being and is the central ministry of the church. Therefore, we will not cancel it. It is understood that many people will not feel comfortable attending in person at this time. It is our hope that those who do not feel comfortable in person will join online.
- 2. Sunday Schools will be given the option to meet or not meet as the individual classes decide.
- 3. All other church programming, such as Wednesday Evening meal, Bible studies, Choir practice, Children and Youth programs, <u>will not meet for the remainder of January</u>. The reason for this is a combination of things. Individual safety, difficulty in finding enough volunteer leaders, and the reticence of attendees have all contributed to making this decision.

Following the trajectory of the Omicron variant in places before it hit Oklahoma, it appears that the number of cases spike quickly and dissipate quickly. We expect that pattern to hold for us. Therefore, we fully expect to return to our regular schedule February 1.

Thank you for your faithfulness and understanding. I find this hiatus discouraging and frustrating, but I am reminded that God is faithful and far more patient than I am. His word tells us that He causes all things to work together for the good for those who love him (Romans 8:28). I trust that word is true. So, please join me in loving God wholeheartedly, and we will watch together how He works this together for our good.

Worship at St. Mark's, January 30, 2022





Using W.O.R.D. as an acronym, they can learn to ask these four questions:

Is there something to make me WISE?

Is there something I need to OBEY?

Is there something I need to REPENT?

Is there something God wants me to DO?


You'll be hard pressed to read a chapter of Scripture and not find an answer to one of these questions providing an APPLICATION to your reading. If not, keep reading until you do.

Explain they are not looking for all four, but ONE thing God wants to show them in the passage they are reading.


We don't read the Bible just to read - we read it so it can change our life and draw us closer to God. Asking questions like these help us discover tour heart for Jesus.


